What is Clean Power Alliance?

- Clean Power Alliance (CPA) is a public entity formed through a Joint Powers
 Authority (JPA) made up of 31 public agencies across Southern California
- Clean Power Alliance serves approximately 1 million customer accounts representing 3 million residents and businesses
- 5th largest load serving entity in the state (between SDG&E and SMUD)



Clean Power Alliance Power Choices

Three rate options for residential and commercial customers



Clean Power 100% Green Power

Lean Power provides 36% renewable energy content

Clean Power provides 50% renewable energy content


100% Green Power provides 100% renewable energy content

1-2% savings as compared to SCE base rates.

0-1% Same cost as compared to SCE base rates.

7-9% premium as compared to SCE base rates.

Customers by Product Type



- Opt out rate of approximately 5% by customer and 14% by load
- We expect to meet the SB 100 state mandates for 60% renewable energy by the end of 2019, <u>10 years ahead of schedule</u>



Renewable Energy Procurement

- CPA procures renewable energy to meet its regulatory requirements and the high demand of our customers for green power, while maintaining competitive rates.
- CPA evaluates projects using six criteria: value, project location, development risk, environmental stewardship, workforce development, and benefits to disadvantaged communities





Renewable Energy Procurement

- CPA launched its first Clean Energy RFO in October 2018
 - Response from over 230 facilities
 - > Resulted in 1.2 million MWh of contracted generation
 - CPA plans to launch its 2019 Clean Energy RFO in October
 - To enhance competitiveness of smaller local projects, a two-track RFO is contemplated:
 - Utility-Scale Procurement Track (10 MW or larger)
 - Distributed Procurement Track (less than 10 MW and located in Los Angeles and Ventura counties)



Development of Local Programs

- In June 2018, CPA's Board identified goals and priorities for CPA's future local program investment
- From May August 2019, CPA led a comprehensive stakeholder process to get feedback from CPA's community members about local program needs
- CPA staff will present a 5-year local programs strategic plan to the Board in December
- CPA will launch a DER pilot in January 2020
- CPA is pursuing opportunities to secure state funding for community solar projects and for EV infrastructure incentives in Ventura County
